## A client's Thanks for Pam's Promise

On September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020 I was rescued, not arrested. I spent 11 months in Montgomery County Jail discovering myself, establishing and growing a relationship with our amazing creator and educating myself on my addiction. I had to get honest with myself and make some serious changes in my life. I was lost. God began working in my life and urging me to change. I completed the women's J-cap program (jail chemical addiction program) and had applied to Pam's Promise. This program has given me so much self-worth. And taught me to be independent. I feel safe here. I've been working on restoring my relationships and creating healthy boundaries for myself. I feel like I'm part of the community here at Pam's Promise and get to see the beauty of fellowship as people in our community reach out to us women. Through work with my case manager Elizabeth, I have gained confidence, established a trusting healthy relationship and am working to become the woman God intended me to be. I may not be exactly where I want to be, but I'm not where I was: homeless, addicted, hungry, lost, and broken. So when I was asked what Pam's Promise means to me, I got overwhelmed with a sense of pride, respect, and gratitude. This program means "Life" to me. Choosing to live and be a part of something bigger. I'm so grateful for this program and the women that work here. We're a family, creating an indescribable bond that will never be forgotten or broken. Thanks to Pam's Promise I'm over a year sober, employed full time and learning to love myself again. I feel safe and alive for the first time!
