The quarter began the first weekend in October with the board and staff meeting with Executive Service Corporation for a Saturday retreat to work on strategic planning and goals for the future of Pam's Promise. That same Saturday, Wabash College held its Volunteer Day and worked with Pam's Promise in cleaning out a garage at the Spring Ledge house. H & M Plumbing began extensive work on water pressure issues at that same house as we learned from Meyer's Heating and Cooling that heating and cooling issues would need to be addressed for the winter months. Realizing the cost of these projects was overwhelming, but thanks to community partners such as the Montgomery County Community Fund, FISH, Rotary, Crawfordsville Country Club Community Children's Charity, and a grant from our local Walmart these issues are being taken care of and Pam's Promise is looking forward to using this house again to accommodate more women and children in great need. In November Pam's Promise held its first ever Homemade Holiday Pie Fundraiser. With the support of community sponsors who funded ingredients and supplies, staff and board members had a great time working with volunteer groups in the kitchen of Christ Lutheran Church making over 225 pies that came frozen and ready to bake for the holidays! Thanks to sponsors, volunteers, and those who purchased pies, the event was a huge success which the board and staff are extremely thankful for as homelessness in our community increases. Pam's Promise witnessed that increase by answering 146 inquiry calls in 2021. With this great need, Pam's Promise is grateful for community partners and each of you who are willing to give or volunteer to help homeless women secure a warm place to stay.
